A parishioner asked for an update on the traffic calming on Hopley Road. The new camera was mentioned which was gratefully received but it was stated that the issue is continuing with speeding cars.

Cllr Jeans explained what had previously been agreed in terms of traffic calming and recognised the bad situation in Hopley Road. It was explained that the project is now 3 years down the line, funds have already been speed on the Traffic Regulation Order to stop heavy goods vehicles travelling through the village, and inflation has unfortunately eroded the remaining reserve meaning that measures on Hopley Road have been unfortunately delayed. Anslow Parish Council have been assured that future finances will be available to help with this issue.

The parishioner asked if there is something further that can be done such as signs to help prevent the level of speeding as concern has been expressed regarding the children walking and cycling to school. The possibility of police vans were also discussed with an action for the clerk to contact Staffs Police regarding this.

Cllr Thompstone explained that Anslow Parish Council are very focused on helping with the issue on Hopley Road with the Speed Indication Device being funded by the Parish Council itself.
